



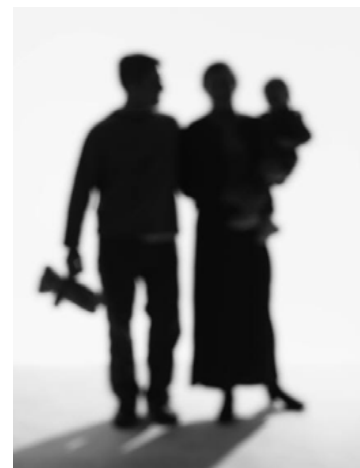
Work Support Strategies Grant: Streamlining Access, Strengthening Families





The Initiative

The Ford Foundation and partners have invested funds through the Urban Institute for selected states to implement more *effective, streamlined,* and *integrated* approaches to delivering key supports for low-income working families.





The Planning Year

States will be given the opportunity to design and test strategies to improve the delivery of work supports to low-income families during the first year.

Some states may receive funding to implement these strategies for up to 3 years following the planning year.

- ▶ Technical Assistance
- ▶ Peer Support

Selected Supports

SC targeted the following key programs:

- ▶ Medicaid
- ▶ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)
- ▶ Family Independence (FI) Program



The Agencies

- ▶ DHHS administers Medicaid
- ▶ DSS administers SNAP and FI
- ▶ USC will provide process quality improvement across agencies





The Opportunity

In SC it is challenging for low-income families to secure needed work supports because of:

- ▶ Existing organizational structures
- ▶ Administrative processes
- ▶ Legacy eligibility systems





The Goals



SC plans to address the work support issues in the following ways:

- ▶ Modernize agency organizational structures
- ▶ Assess and redefine program application and retention processes
- ▶ Build formal mechanisms to measure and monitor impact of process improvement

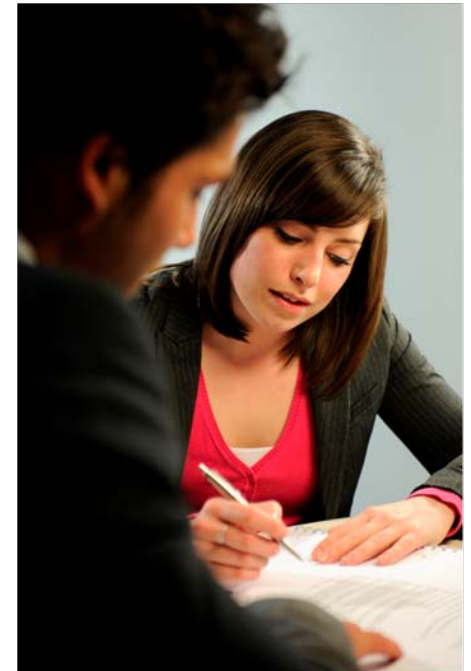
