Job Purpose

In this role, the Graduate Assistant will work closely with members of the IMPH team to support efforts in implementing the Health Policy Fellows Program and other legislative engagement efforts. This position is designed for graduate students interested in public health and health policy. The Graduate Assistant will gain experience in policy analysis, research, and state level legislative efforts.

Role Responsibilities:

- Conduct research and gather information to support the development of data briefs, reports, and other materials to inform health and health care issues
- Support the planning and implementation of Health Policy Fellows Program events
- Monitor the South Carolina legislative session and committee hearings relevant to health policy
- Assist with maintaining a database of relevant bills and policy proposals, prioritizing policies relevant to the current and previous work of IMPH
- Assist with maintaining accurate databases of contact information for legislators and their staff
- Other duties as assigned
